Dear Friends

Jennie writes about salt....

.... The new snow had been trampled by so many feet that the pavement had become an ice-rink. My mother though, was determined to get to the bank, so clutching my arm, we gingerly pressed forward. Then a pair of high fashion boots began to overtake, wobbled, skidded and clutching their older companion exclaimed: 'These pavements, they're a bloody disgrace. They ought to be shot, all of them, and would be if I had my way. It's a crying shame.....'

The angry protest continued up the road as we turned to climb the equally slippery steps of the bank. Standing in the doorway waiting for her to transact her business I watched the passing townsfolk and wondered what difference it might have made, if that morning of first snowfall, we'd each set out armed with a 50p packet of salt to sprinkle on some 20 metres of the route we walked. Surely the accumulative result must be an ice-free high street and perhaps many ice-free pavements elsewhere too?

With February still before us we are not yet out of the danger zone of bitter icy weather. Surely we could do it in Burham and Wouldham? With ample supplies of basic salt packs from Jill and Jim's and Jack and Judy's, could we not have a double village movement to prevent any further snow from making ice-rinks of our pavements? We'd each benefit and be safer, simply by being there for one another through a cheap packet of salt.

That is the style of living that Jesus taught, whereby we discover that deep happiness and fulfilment are found not in seeking our welfare alone but in serving the welfare of others including the community at large. Through such actions, embraced together, we create the spirit of the community we live in. And that communal spirit, in turn, deeply influences the quality and richness of our own lives. The skidding protesting lady might point her accusing finger at some 'them', but God's challenging way for us to find purpose and happiness, peace and security, is through *our lives lived compassionately in community* and a few packets of sprinkled salt next snowfall might help persuade each of us of the fact.

Wasn't it Jesus who said: 'You shall be like salt'?

Welcome back after the Christmas break. We hope that you all enjoyed the festive season and that the snow and ice didn't disrupt your daily routine too much.

Police Officer Jackie Wilkinson has joined the Neighbourhood Policing Team, covering the local area. Further information regarding two additional officers should be available shortly.

At the time of going to press, there are no further updates on the moving of the "children crossing" stencil to the recently installed crossing point in Rochester Road, nor is there any up date on the installation of the 2nd phase barrier outside the school.

The new bench at the left hand side of the top of the recreation ground has now been installed, with funding from our local KCC Member, Peter Homewood.

The Parish Council, together with local residents, are in the first stages of looking at the possibility of replacing the existing skate ramp with a Mark II version. If you have any ideas (sensible ones only please) regarding this, please let me know.

The application for the Valley of the Visions Project Trail has now been submitted and we await further information from them.

Just a reminder that both cardboard and any paper (but not yellow papers) can be put in the large blue recycling bank at the Village Hall site. This generates funds paid to the Parish Council. Last financial year (April 2008-March 2009), the Parish Council was paid £1597 from residents recycling. Let's see if we can hit the £2,000 mark for this financial year!!!!

Also, during periods of bad weather, could we ask residents to check on their neighbours, particularly the elderly to ensure that they are OK. If you or your neighbours need any form of assistance, let me know and I will endeavor to assist.

At our meeting in the village hall, we discuss issues on our agenda, e.g the highways, paths, lighting, the countryside, planning and parking. We would welcome more members of the public to the monthly Parish Council meeting.

There was 'A litter Pick' at Wouldham Common in November. Anyone who sees vans unloading on Hill Rd or off -road motorbikes please take their registration numbers and inform the warden. Mobile 07977982187.

At the December meeting we had quite an extensive crime report. Our Police Community Officer informed us there were: 2 attempted burglaries, a car stereo stolen, and 2 break-ins at the electricity sub station on School Lane. There was also damage to car tyres. Two youths were arrested for possession of drugs, one power cable was removed from an overhead power cable and there was theft of lead flashing from roof of All Saints Church, Wouldham. If anyone sees a crime in progress please ring the police .

Police and PCSO have conducted regular patrols of the High Street in Wouldham due to parking on the pavement and double yellow lines. Please do not park on pavements and leave access for pedestrians and the disabled.

Police officer Jackie Wilkinson will be starting on Monday 4th January 2010 to cover Burham, Eccles and Wouldham. We wish her well in her new job.




