THE RIGHT REV'D JAMES LANGSTAFF

The newly appointed Bishop of Rochester



Dear Brothers and Sisters

I was very encouraged to receive so many kind and welcoming messages following the announcement of my appointment back in June. And that welcome has continued since my move to Rochester, such that I already begin to feel I belong. My instalment service at the Cathedral was a tremendous occasion with a strong sense for me of prayerful commissioning for this new ministry with and for you. So now public ministry among you begins. These early weeks and months have to be about beginning to know the diocese and becoming known within it. So I look forward to visiting each deanery in the first part of this year.

Some have already asked me what my vision or strategy might be, and indeed the profile drawn by the diocese expressed the hope that the new bishop would 'unite the diocese around a shared vision and purpose' and 'develop an empowering strategic plan for the diocese.' I hope that part of my listening and learning over the coming months will help me to discern both what might be the content of any such vision, purpose or strategy and also how that might become something which enriches us all as a focus for our shared walk in and with Christ.

As bishop, I am to be a person who shares with you in the life of prayer and deepening of discipleship. I shall be looking for particular opportunities to be with you in prayer and I know that I shall value greatly those occasions.

Many of you will know that I have a particular interest in the church's engagement with the wider culture and society in which we live. The government's 'Big Society' initiative offers both a challenge and a possible opportunity in this respect, not least because of the positive desire shown by government for churches and other faith bodies to become involved. What this might mean for us as a diocese is yet to be seen, but it gives a particular importance to the task of re-shaping our diocesan structures for social and community engagement. More personally, a particular involvement of mine for over 20 years has been with housing associations. I continue my involvement through chairing Housing Justice, the national ecumenical body concerned with housing and homelessness.

I spoke at the Cathedral about God's generosity and our calling to reflect that in our own lives. So we come to give thanks for the fullest and richest expression of the generosity—God's gift of his very self in Jesus. May we receive afresh with thankfulness that wonderful gift; and may we respond in giving of ourselves in generous and loving service to God and neighbour. *(taken from a letter to clergy)*

May God bless you richly with joy and peace.

Winter in the Garden and over the Churchyard Wall

Some people find the winter months very bleak and drab and cannot wait for the fresh colours of Spring to arrive. The snow has provided a blanket for the garden for many days during November and December and allowed a period of quiet and rest for many plants.

Resting plants and bare branches seem dull and lifeless but take a look with fresh eyes at some of the trees around you. The buds on trees are just beginning to swell ready to burst into life during springtime. Trees can provide a burst of spectacular colour at this time of year, the Acer for example one of the Maple family has a most striking golden bark. The Birch also offers a range of colours from silver, warm oranges and pink hues on its bark. These all are a welcome changes and not to be missed.

Gardeners may have some physical rest at this time although January is probably the only month when there is time to truly reflect, think and plan for the year ahead .

There are of course important jobs in the garden during January, wisteria needs pruning and winter pansies and violas need leaves affected by downy mildew and black spot to be removed. Lawns will benefit by aerating with a fork particularly as it has been so wet. Not only does this improve drainage but it minimises the growth of moss. It is time also to consider ordering vegetable seeds and giving the greenhouse a good clean.

Take heart though for beneath our feet the roots of plants are twirling and flexing for action and bulbs are beginning to swell. Before we know it Spring will be upon us.

The churchyards in winter are just like our gardens and are having a rest. The snow and rain however have made it very wet and soggy under foot . Very little wildlife activity can be seen but the moles in Wouldham churchyard are particularly evident.

The colder weather has brought a lot more birds to our garden feeders and what a joy they are to watch. Don't forget to top up the water as well as the feeders. The beginning of the year is when we in the south can start to enjoy the influx of Scandinavian winter bird visitors. Look out for waxwings, redwings and fieldfares.

It is also the time to place bird boxes in the garden and I aim to place a few in both Burham and Wouldham churchyards to encourage nesting. If you would like to donate a bird box please call me on 01634 672060.

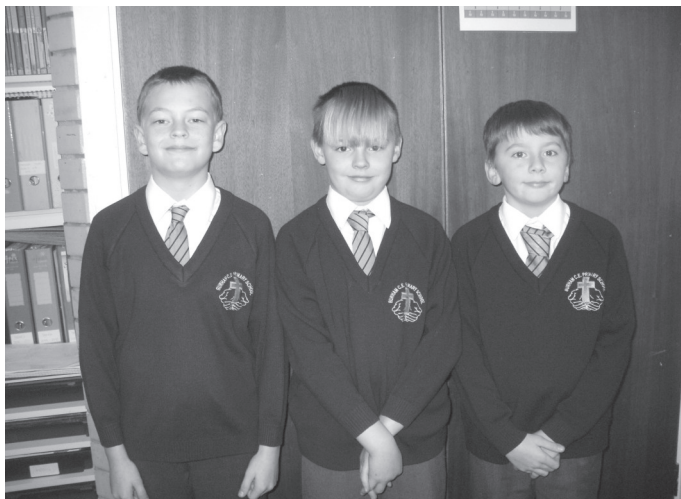

Firstly, the Parish Council would like to wish all residents a Happy (if somewhat belated) New Year.

The Christmas Tree in the green opposite Whitehouse Crescent looked great over the Christmas period. Many thanks to those resident who made donations towards the lights and decorations.

As you are all aware, Jill & Jim from the local shop have retired after nearly 30 years in the business.

The Parish Council and all residents from the village would like to wish them both all the best in their retirement.

As you are probably aware, the developer of the former Fleur De Lys site has submitted amended plans. TMBC are due to consider this application in early February. Let's hope all the observations submitted by local residents are fully considered by TMBC.

Once again dog poo on pavements and other areas has become a problem. If you are a dog owner, please ensure that you clear up any mess that your dog makes. Most people are responsible, but it appears that there are a few who ignore the law. There are many bins around the village which can be used to dispose of dog poo bags.

Whilst it's taken a while, finally Charity Status has been obtained on the Old School Community Centre. Confirmation was received just before Christmas. This is great news to all those concerned.

Byway MR21 (by the Windmill Public House) has been closed from early January for essential work to be carried out by SE Water. The closure will be for a maximum of 6 months, but more than likely for approximately 3 months.

As a reminder, if you utilize the car park at the Village Hall, please ensure that you comply with the parking bays, even if only dropping off or collecting. Incidents have occurred whereby "runaway" vehicles have slid down the entrance backwards, and across Rochester Road into resident's property. These bays have been marked for everyone's safety.

WOULDHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

This month it was reported at the Council meeting that the sheds had again been entered in the allotments. Nothing was stolen, because there are no items left in the sheds; however in this age of encouraging healthy eating it must be so upsetting to know that nothing is safe on your allotment. The whole village must remain vigilant and make sure that this is not acceptable behaviour in our village.

A car was taken from land outside the Waterworks and later found burnt out in Maidstone. There were 3 thefts from motor vehicles. Two wheels were removed from a vehicle parked in Wouldham Rd, by M2 Bridge, after being left there due to the snow. A vehicle was damaged in Knowle Rd. The 2 vehicles parked in High Street were entered, searched and documents taken from both vehicles. This appears to be a common theft every month, so please take anything valuable into your home. Do not leave them in your cars, and do speak to the community team about vehicle theft prevention.

There has been an addition to the “Valley of Visions Walks”. There are new steps on footpath 6 from the Black Robin to Hill Rd which makes the area much more accessible. The steps are easily negotiated, being very wide and with regular resting places.

As a Parish Council we would like to welcome Steve and Justine Church as the new publicans at the Waterman’s Arms. We wish them every success in their venture.

We all need to remain vigilant in the village and inform the police if anything suspicious is seen. The PCSO is Julie Stoner, mobile (07772226237), and the PC is Jackie Wilkinson. Dave Liepnick (mobile 07977 982187), is our Community Warden.

Before Christmas, Inspector Adrian Allen and PCSOs Caroline Honeysett and Julie Stoner went to the Royal British Legion Industries premises in Aylesford with the first prize winners of the ‘Stranger Danger’ Sign Competition from each of the schools in the three villages. The children were given a tour of the factory and learnt about some of the processes used in order to make their signs. The chief executive of the company, Steve Sherry, then presented them with a certificate and replica of their signs. The winners were Nicole Williams for Burham Primary School and Mia Fazzani for Wouldham All Saints School.

Also in November, local neighbourhood officers PC Jackie Wilkinson and PCSO Julie Stoner were involved in the Burham ‘Clean Sweep’, arranged by Kent Fire and Rescue Service (KFRS). This involved visiting houses in the village, along with representatives from Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council and Russet Homes, to find out what local residents think should be the priorities for the area. It was also an opportunity for KFRS to talk to people about the need to leave space for emergency vehicle access when parking, and in the use of smoke detectors and other fire safety precautions.

As a part of the operation, the Neighbourhood Policing Team, along with their Task Team colleagues, conducted speed checks along Rochester Road and arranged for an untaxed vehicle parked in Knowle Road, Wouldham to be removed.
