Jennie writes on the June tragedy in Whitehaven

Yesterday, the Wednesday of the June school holiday, the sun shone on families relaxing and having fun. I was amongst them and perhaps you too. Then news came of how that same sunny Wednesday had been instead, a day of terror, horror and tragedy for the people of Whitehaven, caused by the actions of an unbalanced man lose with a pair of guns. It was hard to hold those two days, their day and my day, side by side and see them as the same day. It was impossible to feel as they must feel, those people in Whitehaven who had been so cruelly bereaved or so needlessly injured.

In such an awful tragedy anger and bitterness, depression and a new nervousness inevitably speak the harsh reality of the deep emotional injuries that people have sustained. What great care they will need if those raw wounds are to heal over into scars, healed scars of forgiveness of a acceptance, of hope and regained confidence.

Many in Whitehaven laid bunches of flowers as expressions of their care and sympathy, and friends, family and professionals will bring a variety of caring skills as helpful medicine. And we too can be a part of that care, even at this distance and even as strangers, by bringing our prayer to the site of this tragedy. Tell your Father God of your concern for those who suffer in this or any other such catastrophe, using your own words or if helpful the words below.

Father God, you have shown us that nothing, however terrible, can separate us from our love. Come with helping, mending love to all for whom great tragedy has happened in Whitehaven:

Heal those who have been hurt in body or heart,

Take into your heavenly home those who have died,

Strengthen all who serve in the emergency services, and everyone who brings aid and comfort, protect the bereaved with a shield of love, give a light of hope to any near despair, and let each know that they are held tenderly in the palm of your hand; in Jesus' name. Amen Yours, Jennie

WOULDHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

This month it was reported at the Council meeting that there was criminal damage, a dent to a front door, and rear door removed from frame in Hall Road. There were 12 shrubs dug up and stolen from a front garden in Garden Court.

We would like to welcome the new PCSO Julie Stoner to our village. Mobile 07772226237

At our parish Council meeting, we discussed at length the cutting of verges around the village. We are concerned that at T junctions the weeds grow so quickly that it can obstruct the view. Due to the economic climate, we must plan effectively and check the work of the companies instructed to carry out the verge trimming.

A lot of hard work is in progress planning the village leaflet and the "Interpretation Panels" for the Valley of Visions. The sculpture near the start of one of the walks has been started. One copy of the village leaflet will be delivered to every household.

WPC are aware and concerned about the issue of Yellow Lines in the village. We are in discussion with Highways to keep these to a minimum, and we are also working very hard on the village's behalf to progress plans for alternative car parking. There are plans to develop a car park for the Church and any other spare pieces of land are being discussed.

There are allotments available, see village notice boards. *(see page 16)* Happy gardening. Now is the time for eating asparagus. It takes 3 years to get a bed established and Kentish asparagus is famous for its taste.

At the May meeting Councillor Dalton was re-elected as Chairman, with Councillor Stead as Vice-chairman.

As you are probably aware, PCSO Allan Newby has now retired. Kent Police have forced Allan to retire on age grounds, and it will be our loss. Over many months, Allan was the face of policing within Burham and the surrounding area. We would like to wish Allan all the best for the future. We are not without a PCSO; Julie Stoner is Allan's replacement. Her contact number remains the same: 0777 222 6237.

As you are aware, the Fleur de Lys has now been sold to Blue Ribbon Development Ltd. Unfortunately, the Parish Council's request to have the building listed was declined. The intentions of Blue Ribbon Development are unknown. No doubt local residents will probably find out before the Parish Council.

The hanging baskets have now been installed and are being maintained by a local landscape gardener.

All the problem drains have now been addressed. Obviously these need to be monitored in the coming months to ensure that the problems are fully solved. If you spot a problem, please let me know.

There is no update available regarding the moving of the "children crossing" stencil in Rochester Road.

Headlands have now planted all the trees (Kent men of Tree, the KM trees and others) along the pathway from the Village Hall to the recreation ground and along the dividing line. Feedback has been positive.

Would you leave a pile of £10 notes on the dashboard of your car in full view of anyone who happens to pass by? Probably not – so I would urge vehicle owners to take the same common sense approach towards all of their valuables, particularly sat navs.

Thefts from vehicles are often opportunistic crimes so you can help by being careful not to leave anything of value in your car and to make sure that sun roofs and windows are closed and all doors locked when you leave your vehicle. Don't give anyone the opportunity to see you putting your valuables in the boot or the glove box, as there are no real hiding places.

Here is some advice that could help to keep your vehicle and property safe:

- If your sat nav is portable keep it safe by taking it, together with the support cradle and suction pads, with you when you leave the car.
- Wipe away any suction pad marks left on the windscreen or dashboard, as thieves will look for these signs.
- Mark your sat nav system with your postcode and house number, your vehicle registration number or other unique number, using the special security markers widely available. Property that is marked is less desirable to a thief as it is harder for them to sell on. Also, if your property is stolen and it is marked there is a greater chance that you will get it back. Finally, if a criminal is arrested with property that is marked it is easier for the police to prove that the property is stolen and charge the offender.
- Make a note of the make, model and serial number of your sat nav and keep this information somewhere safe i.e. not in your car!
- Don't leave any valuables on view in your car.
- Never leave the keys in the ignition when the car is unattended, even when you are merely paying for petrol or visiting a recycling centre.

The simple rule is – if you value it take it with you.




