something new in All Saints graveyard and of a new way of worshipping. Just now a large and beautiful piece of Welsh blue-grey slate is being carved to create a fitting focus for a Garden of Rest at All Saints. Its style and decoration will echo the other old tombstones to be found in the churchyard but being of a much harder stone, the names inscribed upon its two sides will endure for several centuries. I am hopeful that the work of preparing the ground, fixing the bench (kindly donated by a local family) and erecting the memorial stone will be complete by early summer when we will open the Garden by an act of dedication during a Sunday morning service. Then people from both Burham and Wouldham will be welcome to have the ashes of their loved ones interred in the garden (not in a casket) and their name with date of birth and death inscribed upon the stone. There is also a memorial book in the church should any prefer that. Flowers are a very natural way by which many folk continue to cherish the memory of a departed family member, but so often thy are not cleared away until long after they have wilted and sometimes not at all. To avoid this difficulty, relatives will be invited to have anniversary flowers in the church, either at the altar or in a window. Mrs Catherine Gore (tel. 404742) has kindly agreed to organise this.

The new way of worship is Messy Church now taking place from 10.30am on the 3rd Sunday of each month in Burham Community Centre. It begins with 25 minutes of craft activities by which we are introduced to that day's Bible story. Then we and our creations go into the worship room for a further 25 minutes to hear the story and respond to it in our songs, prayers and thoughts. Finally, just as Jesus was endlessly eating with the people he met, we link the story to some kind of snack food which we enjoy together with our coffee or squash. Don't be deceived, Messy Church is not just a service for children, but serious about bringing all and every part of us to God in worship: our minds but also our hands, or thoughts but also our laughter, our heads but also our stomachs, our 8 year olds but also our 88 year olds. Give us a try!

St Peter's (Aylesford) Week WALKS - EVERYONE WELCOME! Monday, June 28th

We are organising two walks again for our St Peter's Week celebrations; in the last couple of years we have had a long and a short walk from Aylesford to Eccles, and last year we were very pleased to have people from Aylesford, Eccles, Burham and Wouldham taking part.

This year we are arranging 2 circular walks starting and finishing at Wouldham Church - where there will be refreshments from about 3.30 pm.

In addition to the walks, we are very pleased to tell you that after we have had a cup of tea, Dennis Worcester will be giving a short talk about Walking Sticks - some of you may have heard (or heard about) the fascinating talk he gave at the Men's Supper Evening recently; Dennis is picking out the high-lights for us now. He will also be joining the shorter walk to give us help in identifying any birds we see.

Both the walks this time will be rather longer than before, so as to give everyone a chance to enjoy Wouldham's position on the river, as well as seeing the view from the top of the Downs, both walks will start at about 1.10 pm. The difference will be that one will be 3.5miles shorter than the other and will be taken at a slower pace with longer pauses!

For this starting time you can get to Wouldham easily from Aylesford, Eccles or Burham on the 155 bus, and return on the bus again leaving at 5'o'clock (or around 4 if you cannot stay for the talk). There is only limited parking outside the church so car share if possible, but there is a car park at the south end of the village.

And if you cannot manage either of the walks you are still welcome to come and look around at the church, and join us for tea and the talk!





Not much new to report this month. As you are aware, the Parish Council had to cancel April's meeting. Both myself and the Chairman were caught up in the Icelandic Volcanic ash problem and experienced delays returning from our holiday destinations (Note: we were in different holidays destinations before tongues start wagging!!!!).

Valley of Visions Community Trail: Most activities are booked for June/July. Keep an eye on the notice-boards for further information/details. Some of the new benches have now been installed. I understand that recently, there was a small queue of people waiting to use the new benches installed on the byway by the Windmill Public House. This is quite a steep hill and I'm sure the benches gave a welcome rest area. Once again many thanks to Wendy Neath who has taken the lead on this project.

Dog fouling: Once again, the Parish Council would like to remind all dog owners that it is an offence to allow dogs to foul in public places including on the pavement without clearing up the mess. Whilst most of you carry and use dog poo bags, a few residents are still ignoring the law. On the spot fines of £80 can and will be issued.

Recycling: Just to advise that in the last financial year (April 2009 – March 2010), the residents raised just under £1500 through recycling cardboard and paper at the Village Hall recycling site. Well done and keep recycling!!!! Barrier outside the school: The second barrier has now been installed by Kent Highway Services and looks good. Hopefully it will improve safety in the area at dropping off and collection times.

WOULDHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

This month it was reported at the Council meeting that there were 2 assaults, one person receiving a caution. There was criminal damage by off road bikes on Trenport land at the top Knowle Rd. This has cost several thousand pounds to repair. The old pit site is an area of Special Scientific Interest. The off road bikes destroy the reptile receptor centre, they cause huge environmental damage and also noise pollution to the biodiversity on this site.

The next Community engagement day will be on May 29th. 11.00—12md in the car park, at the rear of the Medway Inn.

There have been regular police patrols around Walter Burke Avenue to ensure the residents are kept trouble free.

We sadly have to say goodbye to our PCSO Alan Newby who has had to retire, we wish him well and thank him for all his hard work.

The community warden reported that the police motor bike team visited Wouldham School to discuss road safety and find out about the speed watch device.

It has been reported that charity bags have been stolen from outside residents houses in Eccles.

We all have to remain vigilant to watch out for fly tippers. Apparently there are a few unscrupulous people in white vans who collect rubble from building sites in London and travel down the A2 to offload their rubbish in Kent. Wherever possible they will be traced and prosecuted by Clean Kent.

If you see any potholes while driving round the country lanes, please report their size (dinner plate / dustbin lid) and their location to Kent Highways Services – www.kent.gov.uk/khsfaults or tel 08458 247 800.

Meanwhile, the Valley of Visions trail is progressing in leaps & bounds, the paths are being cleared, leaflets are being designed. The sculpture depicting our heritage will be sited near the church on the trail. Road names will be explained e.g. Ferry Lane, Rectory Close and The Tramways.

It is great to see all the fishermen sitting on the riverbank along the trail.

It is the hope of WPC to obtain grants to install adult fitness equipment on the Rec. This is termed "Fresh Air Fitness"

Sadly the Kent Messenger Tree that was kindly donated for the enjoyment of all in this village, has been vandalised. The Parish Council would ask that the whole village would prevent and support action against anti social behaviour.

Working with you in Burham and Wouldham

With summer on the way many of us will be thinking about getting outside to spruce up our gardens. The value of property kept in sheds, garages and outbuildings can be much more than you would imagine – and it is not just gardening equipment such as lawn mowers. Trailers, power tools and bicycles are just some of the items that are targeted regularly by thieves.

However, the following crime prevention advice may help to keep your property safe:

- Put all property away after use and lock the shed or garage.
- Shed alarms can be fitted quite cheaply and hanging curtains or nets at windows prevents the thief from viewing your property.
- Outdoor security lighting can also be installed at a low cost. Security lighting should be fitted at a height of at least 2.5 metres (eight feet).
- Do you have a clear line of sight to your shed or garage? If not, can trimming bushes and trees rectify this?
- Up and over garage doors can be made more secure by fitting a padlock with a hasp and staple to both sides.
- Double garage doors with a rim latch can be supplemented with a mortice deadlock.
- If your garage is attached to the main building ensure that connecting doors are locked and as secure as external doors.
- Security mark your property with your house number and post code. Details
 of specific makes, models and serial numbers should be recorded and stored
 safely. For larger and more distinctive items it is also useful to take
 photographs to keep with the other details also mentioned.
- All ladders should be locked inside sheds or garages so thieves do not use them to gain access to the rest of the house. If this is not possible, then try to chain them up.
- Expensive mowers and bicycles should be secured to a fixed object or the floor to make them more difficult to move.
- And don't forget about house security make sure your doors and windows are locked if you are spending time out in the garden.
- Also please remember to shut your garage doors, even when you are at home. People passing by can see all the property inside if they are left open.


