Jennie writes

Do you have a particular pearl of wisdom that guides our path? My dear old Mother does. From childhood to this day she has quoted: 'Moderation in all things', to which in earlier years my brother and I would gleefully respond: 'Even in being quiet, even in being good?' We knew of course that she meant in respect of indulging us with the little luxuries of life and in the imposing of discipline. It was that balance which all wise parents practice. For myself I find helpful the pearl coined by Lord Alfred Tennyson, 'Wisdom is the art of knowing what to overlook.' It reminds me to always try to look beyond my own passions and hurts and respond to that bigger picture in which others have passions and hurts too.

' The native North American tradition calls wisdom: 'Ways that people may live', a wonderfully broad definition that encompasses the entire breadth and depth of human life and which names what God our Creator wants for all His children:- that all the peoples of this precious earth may live. Iranian people, old people, hungry children people, robust adolescent people, people in dictatorial countries, people in democratic countries ... all may live ... not just survive. For living implies seeing beauty, the freedom to choose, giving birth in all sorts of ways, celebration and discipline. It's certainly not the same as 'going shopping', nor is it 'making a nest' in which to escape the suffering of another. Living has to do with loving life and loving other's lives. Those are the thoughts gleaned from Matthew Fox with which I concur, and from which he goes on to ask; 'where do we find wisdom?' For me, it's source is the Spirit of God who blows freely, unbound by any boundary, seeking a home in the hearts of men and women of good will and of many backgrounds and faiths. Such is the generous care of our Father God.

So I appreciate the wisdom of John Ruskin who, in a drawing manual, wrote, 'I would rather teach drawing that my pupils may learn to love nature, than teach looking at nature that they may learn to draw'. That insight makes valuable all our amateurish attempts at music, cooking, pigeon fancying, whatever, so long as they enable us to see and cherish more deeply the rich gift of life. Also the 17th century wisdom of Sir Thomas Browne that, in the first world war, spoke alike to both conscientious objector and soldier serving in the misery of the trenches. continued

He had written, 'It is a brave act of valour to condemn death, but where life is more terrible it is the truest valour to live'. Today that helps me to regard not just with sympathy but with deep admiration, friends and acquaintances who persevere in lives that are severely restricted by disability or age. All wisdom can be helpful but it is perhaps good to own a pearl that meets our particular need for guidance through the complex labyrinth of life. Jesus was possibly the world's most challenging teacher of wisdom and indeed the very phrase 'pearl of wisdom' comes from a story He told of a man who sought a pearl of great worth. Christians are taught to seek wisdom so that each may live well their gift of life and a modern prayer that many have found helpful is that by Reinhod Niebuhr:

' God, give us grace to accept the things that cannot be changed, courage to change the things that should be changed, and the wisdom to distinguish one from the other.' Amen

Treat yourself to a smile !

From your Malling's Neighbourhood Policing Team What is a bogus caller?

Most people who call at your home will be genuine. But sometimes, people turn up unannounced and try to trick their way into your home to steal your valuables and money. These are known as 'distraction burglars' and 'bogus callers'. They may work alone, in pairs and could be male or female. Children are also sometimes used to trick their way in to people's houses. When a stranger rings your bell, be cautious. Are you expecting anyone? Representatives from water, gas and electric companies rarely make house calls without appointments. If there is a real gas or water emergency, police and firefighters are likely to be present. There are some simple precautions you can take to help ensure you don't become a victim:

- Lock your back doors and windows before answering your front door. thieves sometimes work in pairs, one entering through the back door while the other knocks at the front. Use a spyhole and ask who the caller is through the door first then keep the door on the chain.
 - Ask for and check carefully their identification, even if they have a pre-arranged appointment. Genuine callers will carry one from the organisation they represent. If you are not expecting the caller and they or not carry an ID card, do not let them in.
 - To check a caller is genuine you can look up the number in the phone book or a recent bill and check it against the card the caller has given you. Do not just ring the number on the card it may be fake.
 - If you have any doubts about whether the caller is genuine, ask them to leave and come back at a time that is convenient to you and when you have had a chance to ask someone to be with you.

• Never leave your front door unattended. If you need glasses to read identification or need to go to another room for anything, close the door. If you think you have a bogus caller at your door, call the police on **999** and try to let them know what has happened and give a description of the caller/s If you have information about a bogus caller, please call Kent Police on **01622 690690** or Kent Crimestoppers anonymously on **0800 555 111**. **Remember, most callers will be genuine but if in doubt, keep them out!** If you would like further crime reduction advice, or to talk about any local policing issues, why not come along to one of our:

BURHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Skate ramp MK II: The final application for grant funding has now been submitted. As we have had two other grants declined, the project (providing this source of funding is secured) has had to be split into phases. Phase one will hopefully take place during the summer and then the 2nd phase later down the line probably in two or three years. Whilst we appreciate that this is not an ideal solution, to secure funding for the amount of money that we were looking for originally (£120k) proved impossible and even a fundraising consultant who we contacted, was not prepared to take on the original project. We will keep you posted.

Borough Council Elections 2011: Whilst I am sure that most of you are aware, on 5 May 2011 local Borough Council elections took place. Councillors Dalton and Davis have been elected to serve for another four years.

Keep on eye on the notice-boards as we will shortly be advertising for our 8th Parish Councillor, who can then be co-opted onto the Council. If you are interested, please forward an up to date CV or letter of interest to me at the usual contact address (Pam Saunders, Burham Parish Council, 5 Springfield Ave, Maidstone, Kent ME14 2AQ). E-mails are acceptable (see below for e-mail address). Currently I have two names registering an interest in the position.

Former Fleur de Lys site: It is understood that a new planning application has been submitted by the developers TM/11/00931/OA refers. Obviously the Parish Council will be looking at this application and submitting any observations that they feel are appropriate.

The Parish Council appreciates that parking around the village is at a premium. However, please ensure that wherever you park that it is safe to do so and that you are not blocking drives, sight lines or are parking inappropriately. Your co-operation in this is greatly appreciated. During the last financial year (April 2010 to March 2011), the residents recycled over £1583 worth of cardboard and paper.
