Dear Friends



Jennie writes on waste and hope

When they had all had enough to eat, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Gather-up the left-overs that nothing is wasted. And they filled twelve baskets with the pieces of bread the people had not eaten'. [John 6 v12] I wonder who ate those left-overs? Recently I made 'gooey caramel squares' from a new recipe because the picture of them looked so tempting. Instead of crushed short bread the base was made of suet, flour and milk. It was suet crust pastry of course and not a tea-time treat at all! But determined not to waste the suet, flour and milk I cut off the pastry base, arranged it on stewed apples and served it up with custard. That way it made a quite acceptable hot pudding! And I guess God smiled.

By 2050 there will be another 20 billion people to feed and even today nearly one billion go daily hungry. What hope is there for us to meet that future challenge? Hope there is <u>if</u> we heed Jesus' final sentence in the story of the feeding of the 5000. 'Gather-up the left-overs that nothing be wasted'.

In the UK we presently waste 30% of the food grown. In the USA the figure is 50% and I believe that in Japan it is even higher. Some of this waste happens on the farms when apples are not picked, knobbly parsnips are rejected and over-ripe tomatoes dumped. Even where farmers do recycle by ploughing the crop in this produces only 1% of the energy it could have released as human food. Some of this waste is at production level in factories or supermarkets that make their own in-house breads and other fresh products. Some of this waste is in our own homes when we buy more than we need, often encouraged by a 'buy one, get one free' offer but eventually finding ourselves binning the free one when it's passed it's best.

We of the world's rich nations tend to treat food as something we can consume or throw away without linking that with the plight of the world's poor or the world's forests. However by buying more food than we need, we devour land and resources that otherwise could be used to feed the billion who are currently underfed. All could be fed on a fraction of the food we currently throw away. Equally none of us would willingly agree to the clearing of great tracts of he Amazon forest. Yet that happens every day to satisfy our food demands.

Hope though is ours, for the solution is with us. We can participate with other 'disciples' who are already finding new ways of 'gathering-up the left-overs'. Breweries are now selling—on their malted barley to farmers as cattle food. The organization 'Fair Shares' collects over-stocked food lines from supermarkets [but not those passed their sell-by—date] to distribute to charities like the Salvation Army, and I know an excellent café that always has bubble and squeak on it's menu. Any other suggestions of how we might be 'movers and shakers' in this important hope?

ALL SAINTS CHURCH REFURBISHMENTS

We had hoped that the repair and refurbishment of All Saints Church might be completed by Easter Sunday but the timetable for receiving the ordered floor tiles makes this unlikely. However the building contractors have guaranteed that the East End will be finished and usable for services by Friday 13 May, and the West End, which will be tarpaulined off, soon after. For Health and Safety reasons no one is allowed to enter the church whilst the work is underway without the permission of the works' supervisor. He may be contacted via the Rev Jennie Bradshaw. The churchyard though remains open to those who wish to visit and tend the graves of their loved ones.

Recently the children and ladies from knitting club came to host Worship in order to tell us about their contribution to a global charity. This was to help the other children understand that truly every little thing does make a difference. This also gave us background information for our visitors at the end of the week. On Friday of the same week Carmen and Paul from Christian Hope International joined the school for Worship and told us all about their important work in countries less fortunate than us and how grateful they were for the contributions of others.

My name is Dorothy and about 3 years ago Rev Jennie, myself and one other, started teaching knitting at Burham School.

The children started with knitting a square and were awarded a certificate on completion. I offered to carry on when Rev Jennie left after one year, and the knitting Club was born.

From little acorns we have created many oaks. Some of the children were thirsty for more knowledge and have learnt different stitches and to read a pattern.

Last week I was asked to do an assembly with the knitting club children. They told their story of the squares and that they are stitched together to make blankets and scarves, which are then sent to a Charity and in turn sent to third world countries or people in need after an earthquake or flood. To date; with the help of mothers and grandmothers we have sent 8 blankets to our local charity "Blysthswood" and 4 blankets, 7 scarves and 14 beanie hats to "Stitches of Hope", Christian Hope International'

BURHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Many thanks to all residents who made a donation towards Jill & Jim's collection. Over £500 was collected which was fantastic.

The planning application for an extension on Frosts Service Station shop has now been agreed by TMBC. Building work is due to commence early March. As you are aware, the Parish Council has been requesting speed indictor devices for sometime now, with Kent Highway Services (KHS) always declining our requests. Due to speed checks within certain areas of the village, the Police have now advised that consideration should be given to locating such signs within the village. A letter of support from the Police has now been received by the Parish Council and County Councilor Homewood and this has been forwarded to KHS for their consideration. The letter endorses the need for flashing style speed indicators signs, so hopefully KHS will look at this request favorably.

Whilst it is thought that all allotments will be allocated in April, please contact Councilor Dave Young on 01634 867669 for further information/details.

For those of you that are not aware, TMBC considered the former Fleur de Lys site planning application in early February. During the meeting, a request for deferment was put forward, as it became clear towards end of debate not all Councilors had all paperwork to hand, namely the handout that the applicant gave to Councilors and residents who attended the site meeting. The next Area 3 Committee Meeting is scheduled for 17 March 2011.

Replacements plum trees have now been planted on the pathway between the Village Hall and the recreation ground.

As a reminder because of a spate of vehicle thefts in Eccles, please ensure that all motor vehicles are locked and secure when not in use, even if only being unattended for a short while. It is understood that some of the thefts in Eccles relate to unlocked vehicles and as we know thieves are opportunists. Please also ensure that all valuables including Sat Nav's are removed or locked away, so that they cannot be seen. Also, as a reminder that all crimes should be reported to the Police including anti social behavior.



From your Mallings Neighbourhood Policing Team

Car crime is an issue of great importance to local people and the following advice could help to keep your vehicle – and your valuables – safe.

To protect your car:

- Don't leave car keys visible through doors and windows.
- Don't keep your car keys in an obvious place like a handbag, hall table or kitchen drawer.
- Do keep your car in a locked garage if you can.
- Do ask a neighbour to look after your car keys if you go on holiday.
- Do invest in an effective security system if you are investing in a high value car.
- Do make sure you set your house alarm when you go to bed at night.

Have anti-tamper screws fitted to your car's number plates – reputable garages can give you information about your make of car, or you can attend one of our 'Safe Plates' events – keep an eye on www.kent.police.uk for dates and locations.

To protect your valuables:

- Make sure that sun roofs and windows are closed and all doors locked when you leave your vehicle.
- Don't give anyone the opportunity to see you putting your valuables in the boot or the glove box as there are no real hiding places.
- If your sat nav is portable keep it safe by taking it, together with the support cradle and suction pads, with you when you leave the car.
- Wipe away any suction pad marks left on the windscreen or dashboard, as thieves will look for these signs.
- Mark your property using the special security markers widely available.
- Make a note of the make, model and serial number of your sat nav and keep this information somewhere safe i.e. not in your car!
- Don't leave any valuables on view in your car if you value it take it with you.

If you see suspicious vehicles near your home don't put yourself at risk but if possible make a note of the make, type and registration number and report it immediately to police.

In a recent prosecution an employed builder doing a little bit of "moonlighting" was convicted of not notifying the tax man and so evading tax of £3,558. Originally charged with tax evasion, he would have probably had to pay penalties of around £4,000 (as well as the tax) which maybe got a few months suspended sentence. However, the charges were changed to mean that he had been living on illegally obtained income. Under the Proceeds of Crime Act the tax man then won a confiscation order for over £700,000 (or 4 years in prison if he defaults)! The consequences of not being up front with the tax man have suddenly become a lot worse than a slap on the wrist and a fine. How to protect yourself from Scams

The Office of Fair Trading (OFT) estimates that consumers lose £3.5bn to scams every year, with the average victim losing £850. But many lose far more. Read on for OFT's top 10 tips to protect yourself from falling victim to fraudsters.

- Be suspicious of unsolicited letters, phone calls or emails asking you to send money check out the sender and ask the opinion of family, friends or neighbours.
- If an offer looks too good to be true, it probably is.
- Think twice ask yourself "Can I afford to lose money on this?"
- Never send money to anyone who says you've won a lottery or big prize you'll never see any winnings.
- Don't be rushed into sending off money by time-sensitive deadlines.
- Never ring a number beginning **090** unless you know how much the call will cost and what you will receive.
- Never disclose bank account, credit card or personal details to people you don't know.
- Don't send money just because a letter seems official.
- Don't be fooled by fake testimonials.

It is now believed that £4 billion (according to the National Fraud authority) is lost to scams in the UK each year, with some people becoming repeat victims who can lose thousands. What can never be underestimated is the effect on such victims and their loved ones as illustrated by the Think Jessica campaign at www.thinkjessica.com.

The general advice is that if it appears too good to be true then it probably is. However, it is of concern that those who are repeatedly falling victim to scams will not be in a position to heed this advice. Hoax-Slayer also includes anti-spam tips, computer and email security information, articles about true email forwards, and more.

CUT THE JUNK

You can take some simple steps to cut the number of unsolicited offers you receive by post, phone and email. This will make it harder for the scammers to reach you and it will give you the confidence to treat any offers you do receive with extra caution.

Mailings

Reduce the number of unsolicited letters and other mailings you get by registering for free with the Mailing Preference Service at *www.mponline.org.uk* or by phoning 0845 703 4599.

Telephone calls

Reduce the number of unsolicited phone calls you get by registering your phone number for free with Telephone Preference Service at *www.tpsonline.org.uk* or by phoning 0845 070 0707.

You could ask your telephone company to block callers who withhold their number. They can even bar you from making calls to premium-rate 090 numbers (some phone companies charge for doing this).

Text/SMS messages

Reduce the number of unsolicited phone calls and texts you get on your mobile phone by registering your number for free with the Telephone Preference Service at *www.tpsonline.org.uk* or by phoning 0845 070 0707. If you receive a text/SMS service you don't want, reply with the word STOP. The service should end immediately.




