Dear Friends

Martin Dale writesabout Christian Aid

So many things in our lives come in threes!

Here's one :-

Do you remember at school the three part sentence structure :“ Subject verb object” ?

Eg.”I” (subject)”stroke”(verb) “the cat”(object).

When I was at school we always had that lovely old fashioned saying “A verb is a ‘doing’ word”. It so easily indicates movement or description. In a word it's what you need in order to make the sentence **connect** with itself.

But - and here's a thing - what about the 1960's? Hey - that dates me doesn't it? You see there was this great out burst of freedom of expression and along with lots of great bad grammar!

Do you remember that funny saying “How do you relate?” Now there's bad grammar if ever there was! You see “*relate*” is a verb which not only wants to do things but it jolly well tells you how. In short it takes an *indirect object*. So that sentence should actually read:” *How do you relate to this or that?*” plus just to complicate things, this is also a question not just a sentence!

But everyone left it out; and why was that? I think it was because so so much was going on that you were hard pressed to know what to *relate* to next!!

That's the big problem isn't it? Life is still like that. Since the speeding up of life during the 1960's and 70's life has gone on ever faster and filling up until there's so much you can do anywhere and everywhere that *relating to it* all is often no more than giving it a passing glance while we zoom on to the next thing. How we long to be able to slow everything down a bit and find time to dwell on things before the next thing hits us.

Well I do anyway - and yet I'm a child of my time too. Many people who know me think of me as an architypal “zoomer” always thinking of the next thing and putting much too much information into simple spaces. There you go - I can't deny it.

But I'm not going to do that here. I'm simply going to offer you the chance to reflect on the following:-

“**We in the west** “(subject)” **own**” (verb) “**lots**” (object)

“**Those in the third world** “(subject) “ **still -even now- own**” (verb) “**very little**” (object)

“**Please can we**” (subject) “**share**” (verb) “**our wealth**” (object) ????? (Question!)

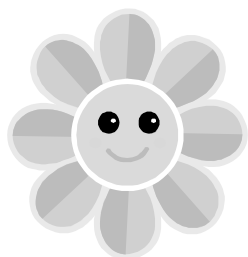

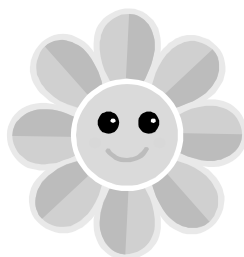

BURHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Police Activities: Whilst the crime figures for March, were relatively high, (13 crimes reported in total), the Parish Council hope that this is due to the fact that residents are now reporting ALL crimes. Please continue to do so. For your information, four of March's crimes were drug related. Also, the Police have issued warning letters to some local youths for anti social behavior.

A community engagement day was held in March and proved to be very successful. Mobile Police units will be around the village on Sat 29 May 2010, so if you have any concerns, this is the time to express them to advise the Police.

Highways: As you are aware, due to the recent bad weather, pot holes are causing drivers problems. If you spot one, please let me know and I will report it to Kent Highway Services. (They have already been advised about the condition of Court Road and Whitehouse Crescent).

Hopefully, by the now the new trees supplied by the Kent Messenger and the Kent Men of Trees have been planted along the pathway from the Village Hall Car Park to the recreation ground to make an "avenue" effect.

Valley of Visions Community Trail: new sleeper benches should now have been installed around different areas of the village. There are many activities being arranged for this project, including photographic workshops & morning bird song (with breakfast) so keep an eye on the notice boards for full details. Other Matters: The KCC members grant from Peter Homewood for the war memorial has now been received and refurbishment work should commence shortly.

As a reminder, the "cardboard" recycling bank at the village hall can take paper as well as cardboard.

False HMRC E-Mails –Be Warned

We are seeing an increasing number of emails pretending to be from the Tax Man and offering tax repayments if you will only “click the link” to claim them. They look convincing, but these are always fake and are intended to get you to give away your bank details to a crook! HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) have confirmed they “*would not inform customers of a tax rebate via email, or invite them to complete an online form to receive a rebate of tax*”. If you receive such an e-mail do not click any links, just forward it to phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk to help them catch the senders. If you think you may actually be due a tax refund come and talk to us...

This month it was reported at the Council meeting that there were 3 incidences of criminal damage. Damage was caused to the perimeter fence of the allotments. A vehicle parked on School Lane was scratched and youths throwing cans damaged a caravan parked in a rear garden. Sadly the behaviour of some youths in our village is causing a lot of worry to our residents of Wouldham. The Parish Council ask that the whole village would prevent and support action against anti social behaviour. Some older residents feel terrorised by a small minority of youths who are destroying their garden hedges, throwing rubbish into their gardens, destroying the daffodils and using unsavoury language.

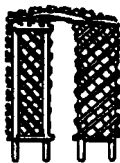
Bat Maze
