Dear Friends



Jennie writes on A. B. C

Alpha is the first letter of the Greek alphabet. It's our A. So it means 'a beginning', a beginning that could be continued on through other letters, more steps if you wanted to or felt it important enough. That's why the course on the Christian faith that is to be held on Friday evenings in the Medway Inn Function Room, Wouldham in January and February 2011 is called 'Alpha'. It's just a beginning, a first thoughtful look at the person of Jesus. And the invitation to 'come and see this Jesus' is warmly extended to all: to life-time believers, to those who want to believe but find it difficult, and to the very doubtful.

We will begin each evening by enjoying a light supper together, giving us the chance to chat and make friends. This will be followed by a film in which the Rev. Nicky Gumbel speaks on:

1. Who is Jesus? 2. Why did he die? 3. How can we have faith? 4. Why and how should I pray? 5. Why and how should I read the Bible? 6. How does God guide me? After the film, there will be the opportunity to share what we thought of his talk, to ask questions, or simply to remain silent and to listen to others discussing the topic.

At the conclusion of the course there will be no follow-up, no-one knocking on your door asking you to attend church or do anything else. Whether or how you might decide to take further steps B, C, D in the Christian faith is your decision and responsibility alone.

For young people aged from 9—13 there will be a parallel course in the same Function Room and on the same evenings from 6pm—7pm, with the invitation, parents permitting, to remain for the supper.

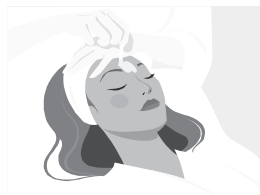

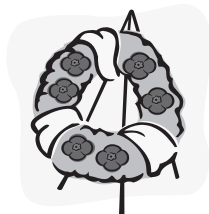

Crime reduction advice from your Mallings Neighbourhood Policing Team

We are fast approaching the busy Christmas shopping period when inevitably we hear about purse and handbag thefts because there are rich pickings around. It is therefore a good time to remind people to think about personal security.

It's very distressing for someone if their purse is stolen but there are some easy things you can do to prevent this happening:

- Use a purse chain to secure your purse in your bag, keep the purse at the bottom of the bag and make sure your bag is done up.
- Wear your handbag across your body if possible.
- Keep your bag where you can see it and don't leave it on the shopping trolley when you turn away to pick things from the supermarket shelves.
- Don't leave your bag on the back of a chair or on the floor if you're in a café or restaurant.
- Don't leave your purse, wallet, bag or any other valuables on show in an unattended car.
- If you need to use a cash machine try to use one inside a bank or shop and don't let anyone distract you while you are doing so.
Don't carry too much cash with you and don't have your bank card numbers written down with the cards.

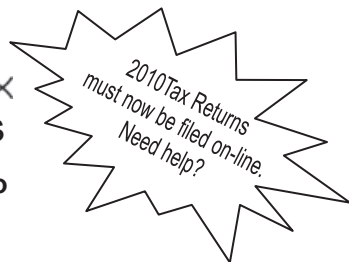

Tax Credits – Should you be Claiming?

A little known fact about the Tax Credit system is that you can only backdate a claim by more than 3 months. This means that if your circumstances change but you don't claim immediately then you could miss out.

This is a particular risk for the self employed who may not know their annual income until after the end of the tax year. In these difficult times it may therefore be worth making a claim based on your best estimate of your income – it can always be adjusted later and though you may risk having to repay a little if you have a better than expected year, you will maximise any benefit you're entitled to if you don't. 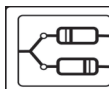

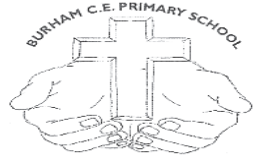

Winter Fuel Grant 2010

Applications for grants towards the costs of winter fuel bills are invited from residents of the Ancient Parish of Burham.

To qualify for assistance applicants should be aged 65 years or over and have lived within the boundaries of the Ancient Parish for the past 10 years.

The weekly HOUSEHOLD income of applicants, i.e. the total income from all occupants, must not exceed £225 for single occupancy or £285 for multiple occupancy. For this purpose, income is determined after deducting half of rent payable (rent after deducting any housing benefit received) and ignoring attendance allowance and similar state benefits and credits. Only one application per household will be considered. The Trustees reserve the right to make such enquiries as they believe necessary to confirm entitlement to the grant.

WOULDHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

This month it was reported at the Council meeting that 4 crimes reported on the September crime report. The first was for possession of a controlled drug, Class B. This was when a male was stopped in his vehicle on the high street, he was issued with a cannabis warning. The next was an assault outside the Forresters' Arms, where a female was assaulted. There were 2 criminal damages to vehicles. The crime statistics for Tonbridge & Malling borough were slightly increased from April to August, with shop lifting down but house burglaries up. BURHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Once again the Parish Council needs to remind all dog owners that it is your responsibility to clear up any dog mess within public places, this includes the recreation ground. You may have seen the posters "There's no such thing as the dog poo fairy". Please bag it and bin it, any rubbish bin will do.

To-date, there is no further news on the former Fleur de Lys site planning application. It is hoped that this application will be considered by TMBC in November. There are however over 40 letters from residents on the TMBC website expressing concerns regarding this application.

Finally, the finger post at the junction of Bull Lane (Eccles) has been refurbished by Kent Highway Services. Comments from residents and Parish Councilors have been very positive. From resident's requests over the next 6-8 weeks, a Christmas tree should be planted on the green in Rochester Road/Whitehouse Crescent. Jim Dowle has kindly offered to donate a tree for this cause.

A meeting was held with TMBC engineers to discuss the traffic congestion along Rochester Road, between Jill & Jims shop and the Chinese Take-Away. Suggestions were put forward. Steps are now in place with TMBC to take this forward during 2011. The legal process is long and in-depth but will include an informal consultation with residents. In the mean time, a log has been made with EDF to clear the overhanging trees on the Village Hall side which hopefully will improve sight lines in this vicinity.

As previously reported, we are endeavoring to replace the skate ramp with a MK II version in concrete. Obviously grants do need to be secured before we can take this project forward. Meetings have been held with 3rd parties regarding funding opportunities and much work is going on behind the scenes to secure money for this project. A public consultation will take place to obtain the views of residents.

The Parish Council is aware of the concerns expressed by some residents regarding the finish of the planters in Rochester Road/Whitehouse Crescent. This has been fully debated at several Parish council meetings and any final decision has been deferred until Spring 2011.

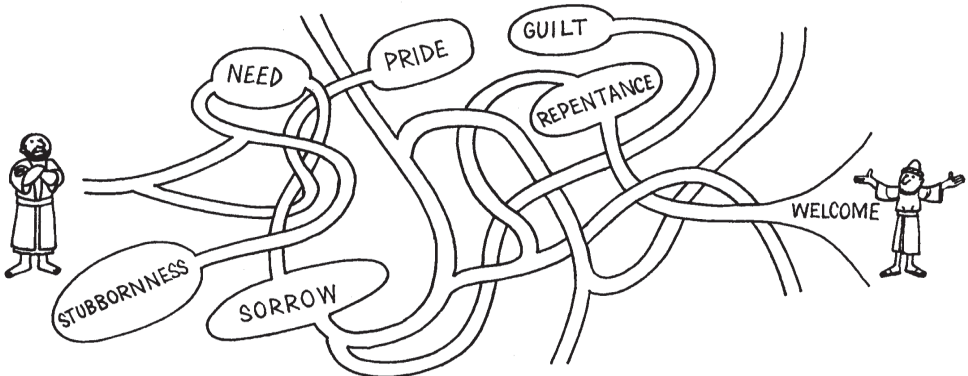
