Jennie writes.....

'It's smaller!'. And it was. The chocolate bar my Mother enjoys and buys when it's a 'star buy reduction' was 25 grams smaller for the same price. Food is becoming more expensive and this is an inevitable future trend that we must face and adjust to. Why inevitable?

Because the world's population is expected to grow by 3 billion over the next 40 years. Currently just under a billion people have a diet deficient in protein and energy. For all 9 billion to have sufficient to eat by 2050, food production must increase by 70%, and that increase be made despite there being no new resources of agricultural land, with growing competition for water, and in the face of climate change. That is the challenge we must face and adjust to but with optimism and hope.

Because, astoundingly plant breeders are experimenting with the world's CO2 enriched air to increase crop yields by 50%; food scientists have discovered ways to create artificial meat using great vats; the UL company Valent is trialling 100 metre square greenhouse farm at Paighton Zoo where leaf vegetables are grown in 8 layers of rotating shelves fed on a nutrient rich solution which is re-circulated if not absorbed and so eliminating wastage. The charity, Capital Growth, is seeking to create 2012 new food growing spaces in London, using all sorts of nooks and crannies from school grounds and canal banks to roof terraces; because better storage and super-markets could reduce food waste in developing countries; because a determination by us of the developed nations to buy only what we will eat and to bin nothing could reduce our food needs by 30% - 40%.

Of course these are all 'ifs' and 'could be's', frail experiments of human-kind's ingenuity, but they do offer points where we too can play our part in facing this challenge. And as food becomes more expensive, let's also treat it as more precious, the precious gift of 'our daily bread' to savour, to share, and to thank God for.

WOULDHAM PARISH NEWS

At the last Parish Council meeting on 7th September, Community Warden Dave Leipnik informed us about a recent 'Bag and flag' day in the village during August. There had been an improvement on the recreation ground with 40 bags collected, compared to 198 bags previously. However, there was little improvement in Hall Road with 99 bags collected in 100 yards despite a new dog bin being installed. Can all dog owners please clear up after their dogs to help keep the village clean.

Children at the school have recently taken part in designing a poster for the 'Stranger Danger' campaign, co-ordinated by the local police. The wining poster will be printed onto signs. Look out for the signs with winning design, to be placed at the school and by the children's play equipment on the recreation ground.

The crime figures for the village cover July and August 2010. There were 11 crimes reported during this period, including theft from a shed, theft of a motor vehicle, behaviour to cause harassment, possession of a controlled class B drug, assault and criminal damage to vehicles.

New adult fitness equipment is coming to the recreation ground soon. The Parish Council has purchased 3 pieces of equipment; an air skier, double air walker and a seated leg press. The Parish Council was successful in its application for a COMMA grant for this equipment.

The Teen Shelter is being refurbished at the time of writing this. Again, the Parish Council secured a Grant from County Councillor, Peter Homewood for this work – thank you Cllr Homewood. The shelter is being repainted, a new floor put in and the damaged window is being replaced.

A second photo exhibition of 'Old Wouldham photos' is going ahead on 30th and 31st October in Wouldham Village Hall. Further photos have been added to the collection. Anyone with any old photo's to display should contact Cllr Jenny Head on 01634 668847.

As the dark nights start to draw in, you may be aware of streetlights in your road that are not working. Please report these to me and I will arrange to get a repair carried out. You can contact me regarding this or any other matter at Wouldham.pc@hotmail.co.uk or tel 01732 870862.

BURHAM PARISH NEWS

It is disappointing to have to report that during the school summer holidays, the six plum trees recently planted along the Village Hall path way into the recreation ground were removed/went missing. Three were found and replanted, but these disappeared as well. These trees were purchased to enhance the area and it is very frustrating when incidents like this happen. Costs for the purchase and the planting were just under £200. If you know anything about the missing trees, please contact me direct or PCSO Julie Stoner. You may be interested to know that Kent Police are naming and shaming offenders by publishing magistrates court convictions on their website. Find out who has been sentenced www.kent.police.uk/justice.

Further speed checks have been carried out in Rochester Road. This resulted in one driver being issued with a ticket and a number of others being stopped and given words of advice regarding their speed. As a reminder, the whole village has a speed limit of 30mph. Obviously in some areas, especially along the main section of Rochester Road, lower speeds are a must.

Flooding at Alex Hill is still causing problems during heavy rainfall. KHS are fully aware of this, and are liaising with PROW, as ultimately it is the debris coming of PROW which is causing the drains to block. Surface work on the PROW should be commencing shortly.

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team are planning to hold a Community Engagement Day in the area on Saturday 9th October. This will give local residents the opportunity to discuss any issues or concerns that they have and to get crime reduction advice - Village Hall car park 3.30pm-4.30pm

There is considerable concern in Burham over the proposed plans for the Fleur de Lys site where the pub has been demolished and an application submitted to Tonbridge a Malling Borough Council for the building of 12 houses. This application will be considered by the Council's Planning Committee in due course. Dave Davis, one of our Borough Councillors, arranged a public meeting early September in Burham Community Centre to update people on the plans and to ensure their feelings are made clear. This meeting was well attended by local residents. (Dave has prejudicial-interest and cannot sit on Area 3 Planning Committee).

It has been agreed to install an ornamental old style phone box in Rochester Road, opposite the junction of Bell Lane. This will be purely ornamental and will enhance the area. Installation should take place within the next few months.

As a reminder to all residents, please ensure that all children/teenagers are aware of the dangers of strangers. If in doubt "shout & go" is a good motto to remember. Obviously if any untoward incidents take place, they must be reported to the Police immediately.

Crime reduction advice from your Mallings Neighbourhood Policing Team

The clocks go back at the end of October and the nights will begin to draw in, so now is a good time to consider reviewing your home security.

Always lock your windows and doors, especially when leaving the house.

- If you go out during the hours of darkness it's a good idea to leave a light on, or use timer switches to activate them while you are out. This gives the impression that somebody is at home.
- A burglar alarm is a good deterrent it's worth getting specialist advice and quotes from several reputable companies.
- Never leave your spare key in a convenient hiding place such as under a doormat or flowerpot. These are the places that thieves will look first.

Instead, consider leaving a spare key with a friend or neighbour.

• Don't leave valuable items or car keys on clear view through a window.

Don't throw boxes or packaging that contained items such as electronic gadgets out with the rubbish as this could alert thieves to the fact that there is new and expensive equipment in the house.


