

Get out in the Gap (GOIG) are introductory walks aimed at people new to or unfamiliar with the area and new to walking in the countryside. Sites

The Medway Gap offers a wealth of accessible locations where rich habitats, wildlife and heritage can be explored. Many of these sites are being used for our guided walks so come and join us and learn about the fantastic countryside that exists on your doorstep.

Sites within the Medway Gap:

Managed by Plantlife, Ranscombe Farm is a nature reserve and country park that lies just to the North of Cuxton. It covers a total area of 560 acres on the slopes of the North Downs and includes arable habitats, extensive ancient woodland and relict fragments of chalk grassland. A large part of the site is within the Cobham Woods Site of Special Scientific Interest and the whole farm is within the Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Facilities: small car park, waymarked trails, views, accessible by bus. Cuxton train station 1 mile.

Leybourne Lakes Country Park

Developed from former gravel workings, Leybourne Lakes Country Park is dominated by a series of lakes and flower rich grasslands that offer both quiet recreation for visitors and a valued sanctuary for a variety of wildlife. The Country Park has spectacular views across its many lakes and out to the North Downs and is home to a range of leisure activities including walking, cycling, fishing, windsurfing, scuba diving and bird watching. Facilities: walking, waymarked trails, toilets, disabled toilets, refreshments (weekends and bank holidays only), visitor guide, accessible by bus, open 7:30am – dusk.



Blue Bell Hill Picnic Site

Located within the Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Blue Bell Hill Picnic Site offers magnificent panoramic views over the Medway Valley, an ideal spot for both walkers and picnickers. It boasts a range of terrain including woodland, scrub and chalk grassland and is part of the 10km Wouldham to Detling Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). The North Downs Way passes along the northern edge of the site, giving further opportunities to explore the Downs. Facilities: parking, disabled parking, view points, open 9am - dusk or 9pm (whichever is earlier). The nearest train station is Chatham or Maidstone (5 miles).

Tyland Barn Visitor Centre and Nature Park

The restored 17th century barn is accessible by bus, bicycle and car. The visitor centre exhibitions focus on wildlife and conservation with plenty of hands-on displays for children. Surrounding the barn a variety of habitats can be found which support an abundance of wildlife and over 250 wildflowers. There is a large pond, meadow, chalk bank and scrub habitats as well as a bird watching hide and displays on composting and 'green picnics'. **Facilities:** visitor centre, toilets, disabled toilet, refreshments (during opening hours of visitor centre), nature park.



Burham Marsh

East of Burham, TQ 714615, ME1 3XY

Burham Marsh is situated between the villages of Burham and Wouldham on the east bank of the river Medway. It forms part of the Holborough to Burham Marshes Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). It covers an area of 57 hectares which consists of reed beds, grassland, ditches and scrub which support an abundance of wildlife and is managed by Kent Wildlife Trust. Burham Marsh is a prime point to observe waterfowl and waders particularly during autumn/winter months and for birds and plants during the spring/summer months.

Holborough Marsh

North east of Snodland, off of the A228, TQ 707626

Holborough Marsh is situated to the east of Snodland and is part of the Holborough to Burham Marshes Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), recognition of the site's national importance in terms of wildlife particularly birds. It covers 35 hectares which consists of a mix of grassland, reed beds and woodland which support an abundance of wildlife. The site is managed by Kent Wildlife Trust and can be accessed by bus or from Spodland train station.

Burham Down

West of Burham, Eccles and Wouldham. Accessible from Blue Bell Hill picnic site, TQ 744622

The Burham to Wouldham Downs covers a large area of the scarp slope on the east of the river Medway. Most of it is included in the Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and the Wouldham to Detling Escarpment Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) which runs for almost 10km along the North Downs. The steep slopes are ecologically rich with a mix of chalk grassland, scrub and woodland habitat supporting an abundance of wildlife. Much of the area is managed by Kent Wildlife Trust.

Sites near the Medway Gap:

Capstone Farm Country Park

Capstone Farm Country Park covers 114 hectares of former farmland on the North Downs and is a popular site with families. The park contains a variety of habitats including ancient woodlands, old orchards, a freshwater lake, meadows and hedgerows. The woodlands are managed in the traditional manner of coppicing and some fields of grassland are still grazed by cattle. **Facilities:** walking, cycling, horse riding, parking, toilets, disabled toilets, disabled parking, refreshments, fishing, play area, camping area, visitor centre, visitor guide, paths suitable for electric scooters, open 8:30am — sunset. The nearest train station is Gillingham (2 miles).

Jeskyns Community Woodland and Greenspace

Situated between Gravesend and Cobham in North Kent, Jeskyns is 360 acres (147 hectares) of greenspace that has been created by the Forestry Commission. It offers opportunities for walking, cycling, horse riding, playing, learning, orienteering and is a great place for all the family. The play features at Jeskyns have been specifically designed and created to fit into the natural environment and to encourage children to use their imagination whilst playing. **Facilities:** walking, cycling, horse riding, play features, parking, waymarked trails, wide surfaced trails.

Riverside Country Park

Riverside Country Park covers 100 hectares alongside the Medway Estuary including Motney Hill and Berengrave Local Nature Reserve. There are various habitats within the park including mudflats and salt marsh, ponds, reed-beds, grassland and scrub which provide a haven for wildlife. The estuary has special protection as part of the Medway Marshes Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and is internationally important for wintering birds that thrive on the invertebrate-rich mudflats. **Facilities:** an accessible visitor centre with toilets, an education room, a café, a children's play area, picnic facilities, ranger service, Sustrans cycle path, trails, car and coach parking.

Shorne Woods Country Park

A large ancient woodland site with a new, modern visitor centre, Shorne Woods Country Park is a great place to explore. A Site of Special Scientific Interest within the Kent Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, there are 288 acres of woodland to enjoy. The park is a mixture of chestnut coppice woodlands that are full of wildflowers in the spring, ancient woodland with towering old trees, open meadows to play and picnic in, and ponds and wetlands that are home to dragonflies in the summer time. **Facilities:** walking, cycling, horse riding, parking, toilets, disabled toilets, disabled parking, refreshments, play area, view points, visitor centre, trim trail, waymarked trails, easy access trail.

Teston Bridge Country Park

Teston Bridge Country Park is the ideal place for a family day out by the river. There is plenty to keep children busy with a large open green space to run around in and an enclosed area with children's play equipment. Teston Bridge is a local wildlife site and attracts many different forms of wildlife. Kingfishers, terns and snipe can be seen from time to time and during the summer months, bats glide up and down the banks searching for air-borne insects. **Facilities:** walking, parking, toilets, disabled toilets, fishing, play area, picnic area, view points, event programme, open 9am to dusk or 9pm (whichever is earlier). The nearest train station is East Farleigh or Wateringbury (2.5 miles).

Trosley Country Park

Once part of Trosley Towers Estate, Trosley Country Park covers 170 acres of beautiful woodland and chalk downland on the North Downs and is home to a rich variety of wildlife. The chalk grassland in the park is classified as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and supports a fabulous array of butterflies each summer including the Chalkhill Blue. To maintain this important habitat, grazing animals have been introduced to manage the grassland. **Facilities:** walking, cycling, horse riding, paths are largely suitable for electric scooters, easy access walks, parking, toilets, disabled toilets, refreshments, view points, visitor centre, trim trail, open 9am to dusk or 9pm (whichever is earlier).

Volunteering

Volunteering is a great way to learn new skills, meet new people and do something different. Whether practical conservation work, wildlife surveying or more office-based activities interest you, there is a breadth of volunteering opportunities available through Valley of Visions. Our partner organisations including Kent Wildlife Trust and Plantlife offer practical conservation volunteering at sites within the Medway Gap. These dedicated volunteer groups help keep these sites and other local public and open spaces in good condition, many of which are used for guided walks in this events programme. So why not join them and give volunteering a try?



Ranscombe Farm

Led by the Reserve Warden these practical work days involve a variety of tasks including plant surveying, fencing, footpath clearance, installing steps and repairing signs, scrub clearing and tree felling. Work days run from 9am to 1pm generally two Wednesdays each month. For further information please contact the reserve warden on 01474 824180 or email ben.sweeney@plantlife.org.uk.

Kent Wildlife Trust

Volunteer tasks are run on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Sundays from September at various sites. Days generally run from 10 - 3:30pm but people can come and go as they please. Tasks include fencing, reed pulling, scrub clearing, coppicing, tree planting, footpath clearance and maintenance and other tasks. Leybourne Lakes

Leybourne Lakes Volunteer Group meet every 2nd Tuesday of the month 10am — 2pm to carry out a range of tasks at the park. Tasks can include fencing, pond maintenance, hedgelaying and coppicing, painting of benches and park signage, ragwort and himalayan balsam control. 


